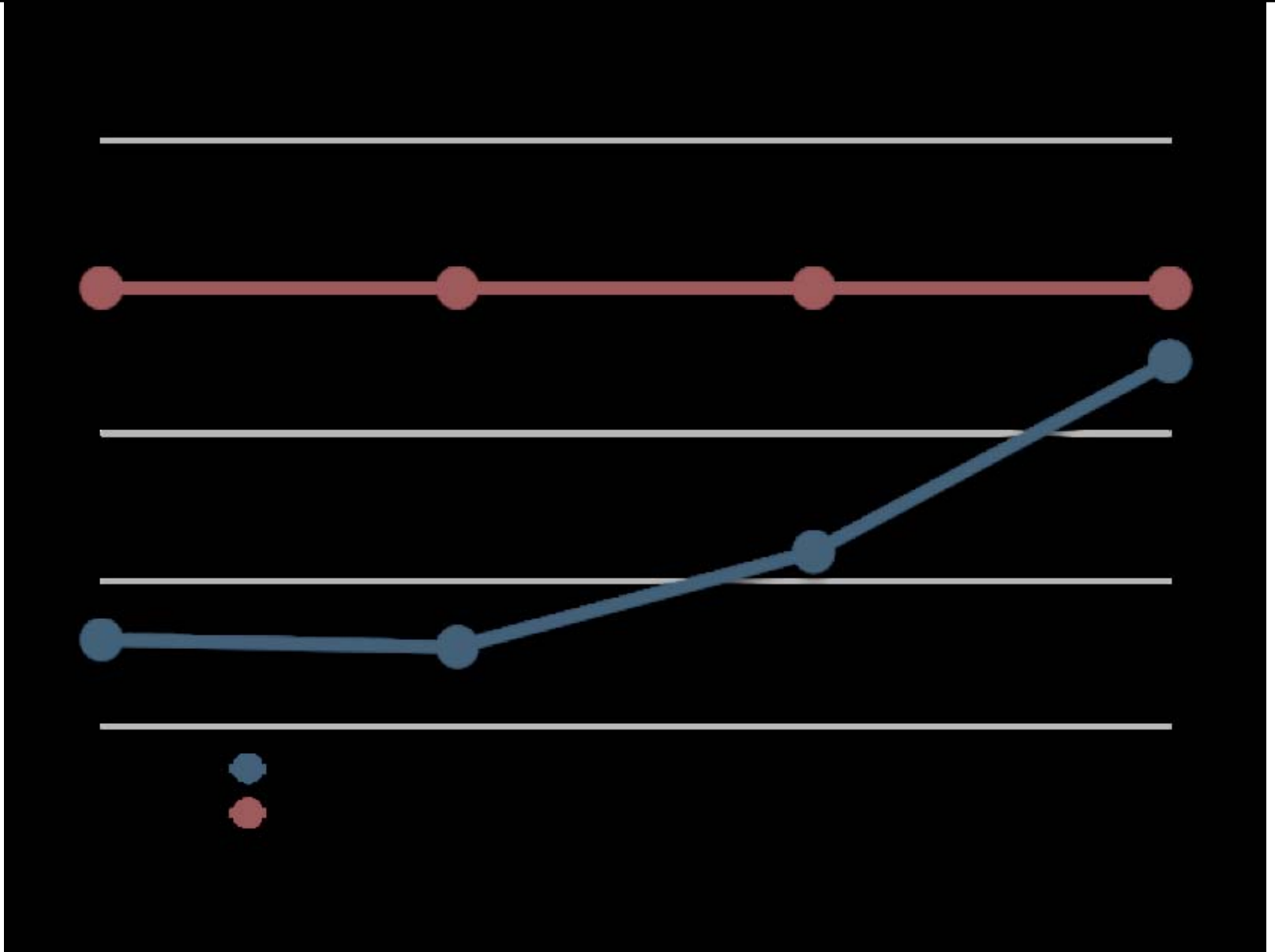

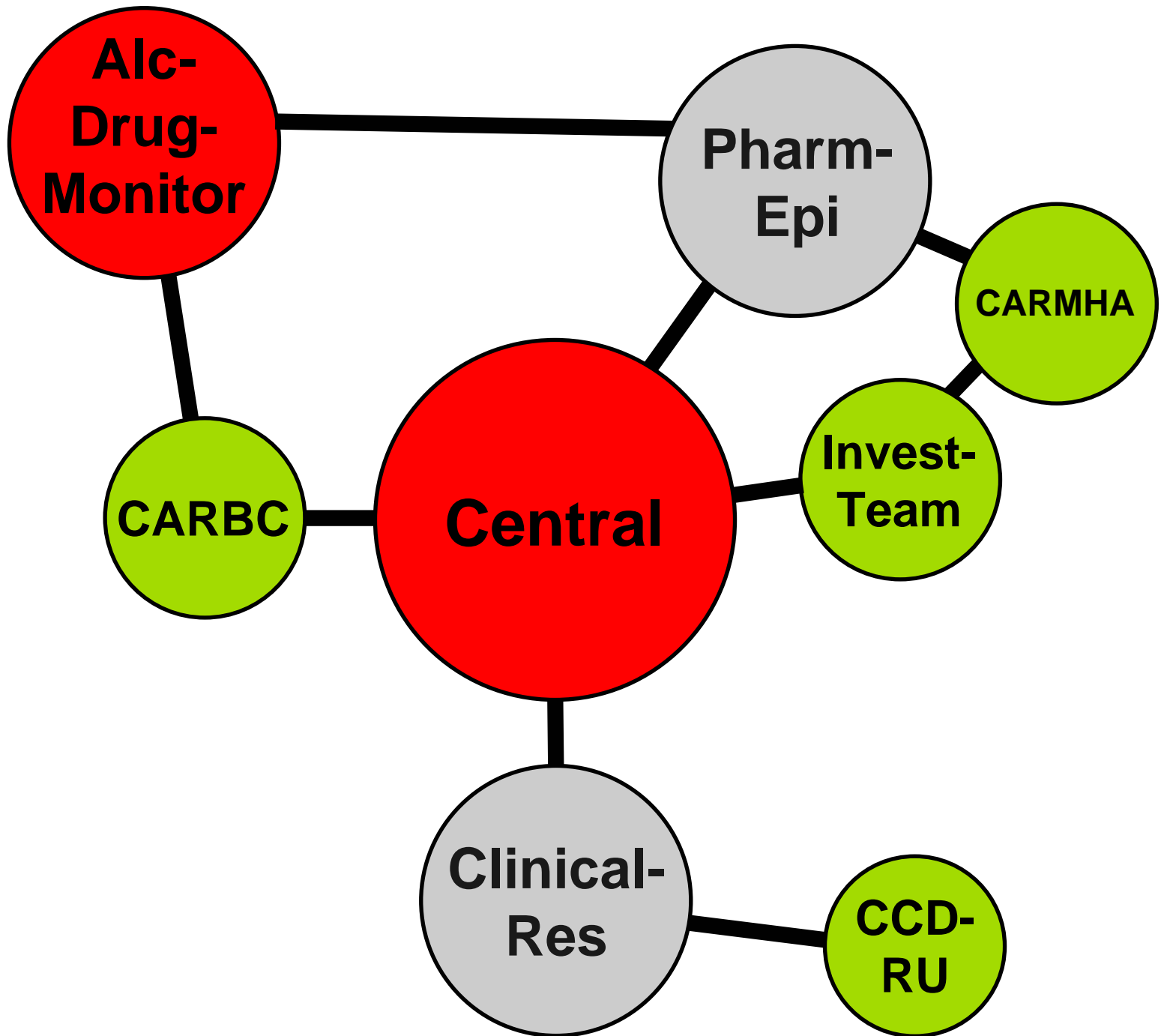

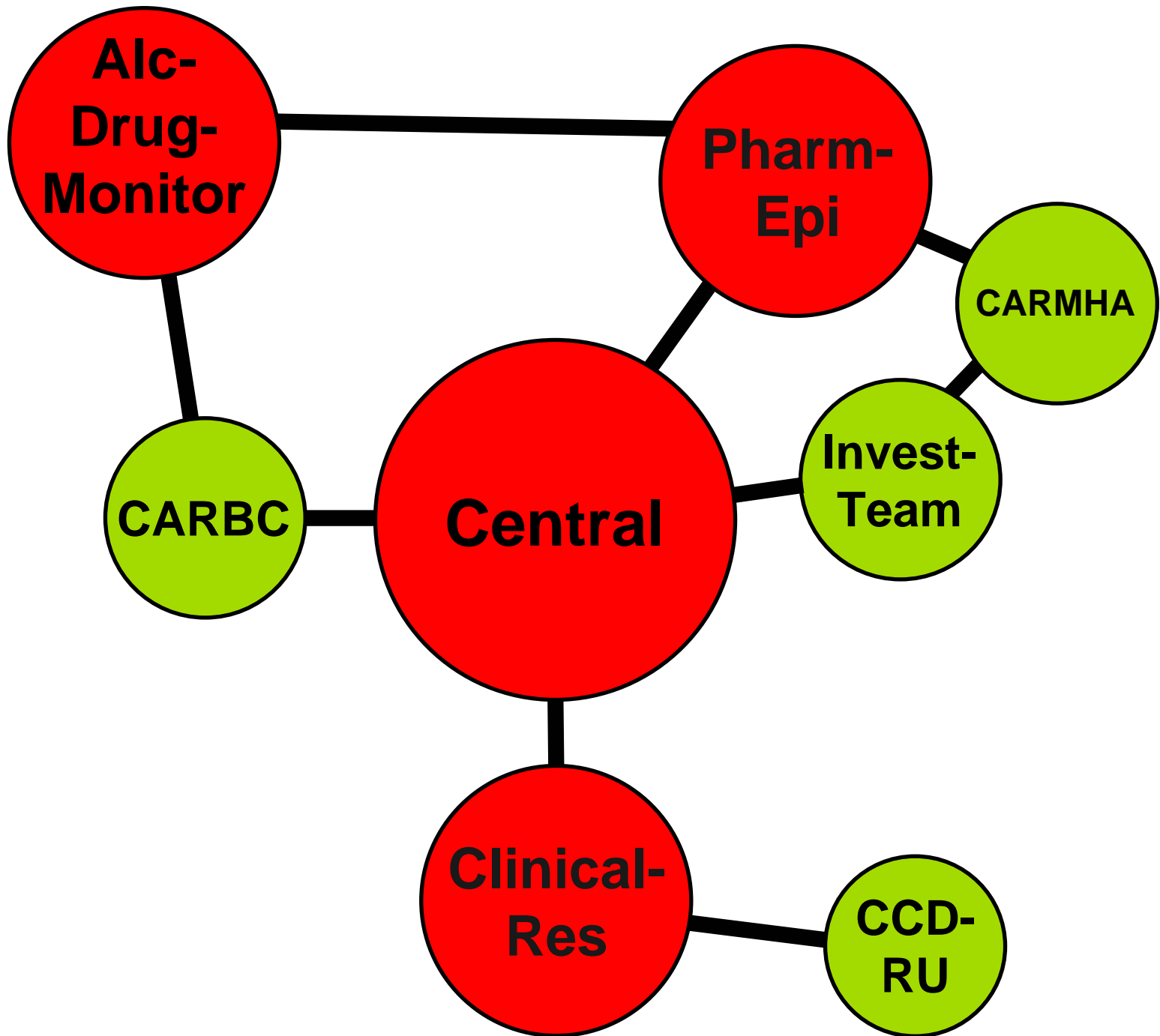
Funding Opportunities

Network Funding Opportunities

The Network can provide funding for a range of proposal development supports, including access to expertise (e.g., proposal writer), collection and analysis of pilot data, travel monies for team meetings, etc. As part of this process, teams will be encouraged to expand and diversify participation by disciplines and organizations. Priority will be given to projects that demonstrate collaboration and networking across disciplines, across sites/organizations, and/or across regions of the province. The aim of these grants is to move researchers from an intermediate stage to a final stage of project and proposal formulation and to make researchers more competitive for securing national or international funding for their projects.
